XVI April–June Lexington ran low on fuel after five days of high-speed steaming and this led to experiments with underway replenishment that later proved essential to combat operations during the Pacific War. Her mission was cancelled and she returned to Pearl Harbor a week later.

The two carriers reached their positions on the morning of 10 March and Lexington and Saratoga successfully attacked Pearl Harbor at dawn on 31 January without being detected. The remaining bombs detonated close alongside and some of their fragments pierced the hull, flooding two compartments.
